## HOW TO DRAW BUBBLE LETTERS

### Lesson 2 - by Graffiti Diplomacy

Step 1. Draw the letters, B A D, with a pencil.



Step 2. Now draw circular bubble shapes around the lines. On the curved lines in B & D, break your circular bubble shapes into segments.



Step 3. Draw around the outside and inside edges with a dark marker.



Step 4. Erase the pencil lines. Add little lines inside to make the letters more bubbly.



Step 5. Redraw the letters close together, overlapping the edges. You can cut them out and move them around if you want, then trace them.



Step 6. Add 3-D ( see our 3-D handouts at [www.graffitidiplomacy.com](http://www.graffitidiplomacy.com) for instructions), a force field and a highlight.






## HOW TO DRAW 3-D Letters: Method 2

Step 1. First draw a word with block letters.


You can add serifs (feet) and corners to make it more interesting.



Step 2. Now from the bottom of each letter, and every corner on the outside of the letters, draw a straight line directly downwards. Each line should be the same length.



Step 3. Now you are going to connect the lines to form the 3-D. Draw a straight line from the tip of each downward line to the line directly next to it. Follow the shape of the letter.



Step 4. Color in the 3-D.





## How To Draw Bubble Letters

1. Draw a "T" lightly in pencil.
2. Now draw an outline all around it.  
The outline should be the same distance all the way **around the letter**.
3. Draw several more outlines until you get it the size you want.
4. Make sure it looks soft and bubbly with no sharp edges or corners.
5. Erase all the inside lines.
6. If you'd like your bubble letter to be even puffier, draw circles on the ends of the letter.
7. Now go over the entire outline with a black marker (Sharpies are best, 'cause they don't smear) and erase any more pencil lines. You should have a nice, round bubble letter.
8. Add extra lines inside it to indicate puffiness. Do the whole alphabet for practice.







# HOW TO DRAW A WILDSTYLE "H"

- by Graffiti Diplomacy


**Step 1.** Start by drawing an "H" with a pencil. You should have 2 vertical strokes and one horizontal stroke.




**Step 2.** Draw a bar around each stroke. Overlap the edges of the bars.




**Step 3.** Erase all of the inside guidelines.



**Step 4.** Now bend the 2 vertical bars and the horizontal bar.




**Step 5.** Draw 4 small bars at the top and bottom ends of the vertical bars to form serifs. Then draw a long, curvy arrow extending off the bar on the right side.



**Step 6.** Draw a dark line all around the outside edges. Draw 2 small bits. Erase all of the inside guidelines. This is your finished Wildstyle letter.

## How To Draw 3 Dimensional Letters: Method 3 - Vanishing Point

Letters on a page look flat. That is called "2 dimensional". You can give your letters depth by drawing the sides of the letter, as well as the front. Even though you're still drawing just lines on a piece of paper, your letters will have the "illusion" of depth. They will look "3 dimensional", like they can jump off the paper at you. This is called drawing in "perspective".

In a "3 dimensional" drawing, a "vanishing point" is a point at which all imaginary lines of "perspective" converge. You can place a vanishing point anywhere on your drawing that you wish.
